Thousands of sea lion pups have ended up on beaches along the California coast. They are not there to soak up the sun. The pups are sick and without their mothers.

Sea lions are mammals that care for their pups. Sea lion pups learn to swim and hunt at about two months old. However, mother sea lions nurse their babies for six months to a year before they are strong enough to survive on their own.

Sea lions gather to breed in large colonies on islands such as the Channel Islands. The sea water around these islands is warmer than usual. The warm water is driving anchovies, sardines, squids, and other sea lions' prey away. This means that mother sea lions have to spend more time away from their pups to hunt for food.

The starving pups eventually swim away from home in a desperate search for food. However, as they are too young to travel far, the pups are drifted ashore.

California rescue centres are trying to save as many of them as possible. The workers feed them smoothies of herring, salmon oil and other nutrients to nurse them back to health.

Unfortunately, many of these pups are already too sick to be saved when they are washed ashore. Only about half of them can be treated.

### Section J: Open-Ended Comprehension (10 marks)

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow. Write your answers in complete sentences.

Lim Bo Seng, a well-known war hero of Singapore, was born in China in 1909 and came to Singapore at the age of sixteen to study at Raffles Institution.

War broke out between China and Japan in 1937. Lim Bo Seng actively participated in anti-Japanese activities by boycotting Japanese goods and helping to raise funds to support the war effort in China. In 1941, he was put in charge of organising a group of volunteers in Singapore to resist the Japanese who were advancing towards Southeast Asia, including Singapore.

When war came to Singapore in 1942, Lim Bo Seng travelled to India to be trained to fight in the jungle. He later recruited and trained hundreds of secret agents and set up an intelligence network in Malaya. This network helped to collect information about their enemy's activities.

Unfortunately, there were traitors in the network, who leaked out information to the Japanese. This led to the capture of many anti-Japanese activists. Lim Bo Seng was captured in March 1944. To force him to reveal the names of the people who had worked with him against the Japanese, his captors tortured him brutally. However, he stood firm and refused to betray his comrades.

Due to the dirty living conditions in the prison, a few months after being captured, Lim Bo Seng fell ill. On 29 June 1944, he passed away due to an inflammation of the intestine. He died at the age of thirty-five, leaving behind his wife and seven children.

His children fondly remember their father as a loving father and a noble man who had lived and died for what he believed in.
