



Will Keith Kellogg, founder of the cereal company, found his first job as a stock-boy, and became a travelling broom salesman in his late teens. He then worked as a clerk at a hospital, assisting his brother in the research for a vegetarian diet for patients.

Will Kellogg stumbled on a major break-through when he accidentally left a pot of 5 boiled wheat to stand and become tempered. When it was put through the usual rolling process, each grain of wheat emerged as a large, thin flake. Kellogg persuaded his brother to serve the food in flake form, and it was an immediate favourite among the patients.

Soon it was being packaged to meet hundreds of mail order requests after they ¹⁰ left the hospital. With an understanding of marketing techniques and hard work, Kellogg successfully expanded his business.

Even as a millionaire, Kellogg lived a comparatively modest life. He once wrote, "I want my sons to develop into conscientious and truthful men."

As his wealth grew, Kellogg gave generously to charity, many involving children. *15* Through his philanthropic work, Kellogg demonstrated great compassion and acted on his belief that the most good came from helping people to help themselves - giving them the opportunity to do what is important to them. Even though Kellogg is no longer alive, his legacy lives on.
