

music and art. With ambitious relatives around her fighting over the throne, she
developed nerves of steel.

At age eighteen, she became the queen of Egypt. She was determined to keep the royal family in power and make Egypt strong and independent. She wanted to avoid war with the other kingdoms. The eight languages she spoke were useful during discussions with other countries and she rarely needed an interpreter. The ordinary Egyptians had good opinions of her as she governed the country wisely.

During her travels, Cleopatra looted foreign libraries for precious papyrus scrolls\* to add to her world-famous library. She spent much of her time alone there.

Renowned for her great beauty, Cleopatra constantly experimented with makeup, hairstyles and new perfumes made from exotic flowers. She bathed in donkey's milk and soothed her flawless skin with fresh aloe vera leaves.

Cleopatra's relatives found her dead at age thirty-nine, lying on a golden couch, oil of cinnamon on her hair, crown perfectly in place. According to legend, that night, she ate a magnificent meal, had her hairdresser and lady-in-waiting bathe her, and allowed herself to be bitten by a viper.
