When shopping, look for green label products as far as possible. Eco-friendly products, which are non-toxic, are both safe for the environment and human.







In 2011, about 6.9 million tonnes of waste was generated in Singapore. More than 30% of our waste is packaging materials — food and drink cans, glass bottles and jars, plastic and metal jars and covers. Where do they go?



59% of our waste is recycled while 41% of it is disposed. Some of the garbage is sent to a dump or landfill, where it can take from 100 to 400 years for materials like cloth and aluminium to decompose. Glass has been found in perfect condition after 4,000 years on earth!

We will be running out of space if we continue to pile up our land with rubbish. It is **high time** to seriously practise 3Rs: Reduce, Reuse and Recycle.

Reduce

Reduce means using fewer resources. You do not need to stop buying things completely or all at once. You can cut back gradually from where you are now.

When you shop, look for things that last - things that are not just durable and well-made but useful and beautiful enough to please you for a long time. Find out how to keep the item in shape. Then, maintain it accordingly and repair it when necessary.

Do not buy things on an impulse or simply because it looks good.




Reuse

Before you dispose of anything, consider whether it can be used in another way. A jam jar can store leftovers. An old shirt can become a tote bag. A magazine can be shared. A computer can be upgraded. A cell phone can be donated, and so on. Reusing gives old resource a new lease of life and keeps it from becoming garbage.



Recycle





Recycling is the "R" that has caught on the best because there are so many recycling programs today. However, there are rules that need to be followed.

For example, some recycling centres are particular about the plastics they accept for recycling. Most only take packaging made from #1 and #2 resins. You need to look at the bottom of the package for the symbol and check that the number is right. The wrong kind of plastic can "contaminate" the whole batch of recycled plastic, turning it into garbage.
