Canadians and tourists from as far as France and Australia enjoy a longer ski season because The Blue Mountain's Ski Resort has an advanced way of making snow. In fact, Blue Mountain boasts the largest snowmaking system in the country.

It has 420 guns that fire water droplets into the air, making artificial snow to cover the mountain. A dedicated team of workers, called groomers are employed to work the guns so that the mountain has a thick layer of snow all season long.

The ski park operates from 8 am to 6 pm daily, 7 days a week throughout the winter season. Skiers are strongly encouraged to purchase their entrance tickets online to avoid the long waiting time at the counters.

In spring, water from The Blue Mountain flows into a nearby lake. Visitors can then go to the mountain for trekking, camping and fishing in the summer. They can even stay a night in the Swiss-style chalets and enjoy the beautiful mountain view.

Fifteen lifts carry visitors up Blue Mountain to enjoy a spectacular view of the lake from a height of 720 feet in summer. In winter, these high-speed lifts are designed specially for skiers to maximize their time on the hill by getting them from base to peak in under 3 minutes. Non-skiers are not allowed on these high-speed lifts. Instead, they may board a sight-seeing gondola which will take them up Blue Mountain. The gondola, which resembles a large cable car, is in operation throughout the day. However, the lifts close for an hour at 12 noon daily for maintenance.

The gentle slopes of Blue Mountain make learning to ski a relaxing experience too. First-timers can enroll for ski lessons and hit the slopes quick enough to enjoy the thrill down the beginner slopes.


