

Only when Sang Nila Utama threw his crown into the sea did the storm stop and they eventually reached Temasek.

On the island, he saw a fine animal and his minister told him it was a lion. He believed it was a good omen and decided to build his city in Temasek. He renamed the island 'Singapura' which translates to 'Lion City'. That is how Singapore got its name. However, up to this day, some experts maintain that lions have never lived in Singapore and Sang Nila Utama had probably seen a tiger. We will never know for sure.
