Helen Keller's growth was normal until she was 19 months old when she had a high fever and almost died. Amazingly, Helen recovered. Even though Helen survived the illness, she lost her eyesight and hearing.

As Helen grew older, she became frustrated as she had to rely on only touch to discover the world. Her frustration led to many behavioural problems; she threw terrible temper tantrums and had horrible table manners. Eventually, Helen's mother found Anne Sullivan, a teacher, to help Helen.

Anne began by teaching Helen to spell with her fingers and correcting Helen's bad behaviour. Helen's behaviour improved, but she did not truly understand finger spelling. It was only when Anne poured water on one of Helen's hands and finger-spelled the word "water" on the palm of Helen's other hand that Helen finally understood what Anne was saying. From then on, Helen became interested in studying and quickly learned hundreds of words in a short time.

Helen eventually learned Braille, an alphabet system that the blind use to read words by feeling dots. With this, Helen became a writer and lecturer, working to improve lives for the blind and deaf people.
