Section G: Comprehension 1 (8 marks)

What is a White Rhinoceros?

The white rhinoceros is one of the largest land mammals, second to the elephant. It can grow up to four metres long and weigh more than 2,000 kilograms.

The white rhinoceros is not actually white, even though its name says so. Its name comes from a Dutch word, *wijde*, meaning "wide", which refers to its wide, square-shaped mouth. This special mouth shape helps it graze on grass, which is its main source of food. The white rhinoceros has two horns, mainly used to defend itself and its calves, and sometimes to dig for water.

Habitat and Behaviour

The white rhinoceros lives in the open grasslands and savannahs of Africa. It has poor eyesight but excellent hearing and a strong sense of smell, which help it notice danger and escape from predators. During the warmest parts of the day, the white rhinoceros moves to shady spots or rolls in mud. These behaviours protect its thick skin from insect bites and sunburn.

Threats and Protection

People illegally hunt white rhinoceroses for their horns, which some people believe can cure illnesses. Also, it is tough for the white rhinoceroses to survive when their homes are being destroyed. Many wildlife parks now protect the white rhinoceroses and stop people from hunting them. If we continue to care for them, we can still save these gentle giants.
