

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow.

A man was walking through an elephant camp when he spotted adult elephants not kept in cages or held by any metal chains. All that was holding them back from escaping the camp, was a small piece of rope tying one of their legs to a wooden stick stuck to the ground.

As the man gazed upon the elephants, he was completely confused. 5
He could not understand why the elephants did not think of using their strength to break away from the rope and the stick. They could easily have done so, but they did not even try.

Curious to know the answer, he asked a trainer nearby why the elephants were just standing around and have never tried to escape. The 10
trainer explained that the herd of elephants had been captured since they were young. At a young age, a short piece of rope was strong enough to tie them to the wooden stick stuck to the ground. This prevented them from escaping. As these elephants grew bigger, they continued to believe that it would be impossible for them to break free. Since the elephants had failed 15
to escape when they were young, they continued to believe that it was impossible to escape and did not bother to try to break free anymore.

The man realised that it was not the ropes that were holding the adult elephants back. It was their own belief that it was just impossible for them to escape that caused the elephants to be stuck right where they were. 20
