Camels, also known as 'ships of the desert', go back millions of years. They are a mode of transport in the desert.

There are two kinds of camels. They are the Arabian and Bactrian species. Arabian camels have one hump and they are found in the Middle East and India. They are used for racing and riding. Bactrian camels have two humps and they are found in the Gobi Desert in Asia. Bactrians have short legs and long wool.

Camels have many ways of surviving in the desert despite the scarcity of food and water. A camel has a leathery mouth and tongue, which enable it to eat thorny desert plants. A camel can also drink a hundred litres of water within ten minutes and this allows it to live without taking in water for three or four days.

Camels have broad, padded toes which are insulated to avoid the sand's heat. The strong, flexible web of the toes also prevents them from sinking into the sand while travelling. Padding on their knees serves as support when they fall or lie down.

To protect their eyes from the blowing sand, camels have double rows of long, curled eyelashes. They can close their noses by contracting the circular muscle during sandstorms. Under the strong heat in the deserts, camels can sweat to remove heat. They are also able to tolerate higher dehydration levels as compared to other mammals so they can survive even though they lose water from sweating.

Camels are often the preferred mode of transport in the deserts due to their stability and their ability to provide milk for the passengers.

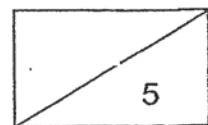

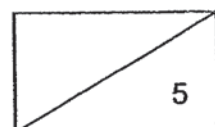
