Roald Dahl was born in Wales in 1916 to Norwegian parents. As a child, he loved chocolate and sweets, which later inspired him to write "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory." His childhood was **not always happy** though - he lost his sister and father at a young age. Also, he had some terrible experiences at boarding school where teachers were very strict.

When he grew up, Dahl became a fighter pilot during World War II. He was very brave and flew many dangerous missions until he was injured in a terrible plane crash. While recovering, he began writing about his adventures, which sparked his interest in becoming an author. His first children's book, "James and the Giant Peach," was published in 1961.

Dahl went on to write many beloved children's books, including "Matilda", "The BFG" and "The Witches". He wrote in a special way that children loved. His stories were funny. Influenced by his time in the air force and his experiences at school, the stories were also sometimes quite dark, filled with horrible villains and clever children who outsmarted them. He made up wonderful new words like "snozzcumber" and "whizzpopping," which made his readers laugh out loud.

Every day, Dahl would write his stories in a small hut in his garden, sitting in an old armchair with a special writing board on his lap. He always used yellow paper and pencils and would spend hours crafting his tales. Standing at 1.98 metres, he was very tall! Despite that, he managed to squeeze himself into this tiny writing space where he created his magical worlds.

Dahl died in 1990, but his literary works continue to enchant children globally. His stories have been translated into many languages and turned into successful films. Today, he is remembered as one of the greatest children's authors of all time, who showed that with imagination and creativity, anything is possible.




