




The extract is taken from an article in a newspaper about how to make every MRT trip a comfortable and safe one.

Have you wondered what makes the MRT (Mass Rapid Transit) trains in Singapore a safe and convenient mode of transportation? The authorities take important steps to provide a smooth and comfortable ride for all.

Firstly, safety regulations are vital. Platform screen doors prevent passengers from falling onto the train track. Passengers are also advised to stand behind the yellow safety line while waiting for the arrival of the train. While riding the train, standing passengers are advised to hold onto handrails to prevent accidents and injuries especially when the train is moving.

Secondly, the train follow a regular schedule for inspections. Such routine checks keep them running in tip-top operating conditions. The train tracks are also monitored and maintained to ensure they can function properly.

Lastly, it is everyone's responsibility to make MRT rides comfortable. Passengers who want to board the train should queue at the door. They should wait patiently for passengers to alight from the train before boarding. When making a conversation, people should speak softly. Showing considerate behaviour will allow people of all ages from all walks of life to have a pleasant trip on the train.

In summary, the factors that make the MRT an exemplary public transportation system are safety regulations, routine checks and commuters who exercise positive social behaviour.

I could not believe it. I started chanting "**Finders keepers, losers weepers!**" under my breath. My mother, who was helping to sort laundry in the next room, called out, "How's your painting job coming along, sweetie?" "Fine, Mom! Almost done!" I shouted back, quickly shoving the **windfall** into the drawer and shutting it. 10 15

That night as I lay in bed, I was brimming with anticipation. I could finally buy that amazing bicycle I longed for. I pulled out the documents again. Reading them carefully, I realised it was a will! It stated that the money had belonged to an old lady named Mrs Leong, who left it for her son. Queasiness started churning in my stomach. 20

Do I keep the money, or give it back? My mind raced. I thought about a recent mathematics test I had taken. I had flunked it, but I could have cheated easily when Mrs Tan, my teacher, turned her back. "That wouldn't be right," I had told myself then. I did not cheat because I knew it was important to be honest. This felt like another test, a much bigger one -- of my character. 25

The next morning, I gathered my courage. "Dad, I have to show you something," I said, my voice a little shaky. I pulled out the envelope and handed it over to him. He studied the contents and his eyes widened. He called the manager of "Relics & Riches" on the phone immediately. After a quick exchange with him, my father and I hurried to the shop. 30

Mrs Leong's son and his wife soon showed up, having been informed by the manager earlier. "We can't thank you enough," Mrs Leong's son said, his voice **thick with emotion**. "This is truly an answer to our prayers as I had lost my job last month," he added. His wife nodded, tears welling in her eyes. The money would help them pay their bills. 35

Walking out of the store that day with my father, I felt lighter than I ever had before. Better than any new bicycle could have made me feel. I had flunked the mathematics test, but I had **passed a more important one**. That was something truly special.
