While video games can improve problem-solving skills, creativity and social interaction, excessive gaming can lead to significant problems. One of the main concerns is addiction, which affects millions worldwide and can harm personal relationships, academic performance and overall well-being.

Many games are intentionally designed to be addictive, offering instant rewards and incentives that encourage daily play. Playing too many video games can make people forget their real-life duties, like studying or helping at home, because they care more about winning in the game. Some games also have features like loot boxes or in-game purchases, where players spend real money to get random rewards. This can make some people keep spending more money, even children. Additionally, spending too much time gaming can contribute to physical and mental health problems, including poor sleep, social withdrawal, fatigue and lack of motivation. It can also reduce focus and concentration, making it harder to perform well in school or work.

Gaming can be enjoyable and beneficial, but overindulgence can negatively affect one's health relationships and quality of life. Thus, it is important to keep a healthy lifestyle with enough sleep, exercise and spend time with family.






