Since I was little, I had always been sickly. Colds clung to me like shadows, fevers came without warning, and I got tired more easily than other children. While my classmates ran wild on the playground, I sat bundled in a sweater, watching from the sidelines. Convinced that a jade pendant would keep me safe, my mother tied a small green stone around my neck with a red string. "Son, never take this off," she warned. "It will protect you." 5

I went through many pendants over the years. "It's bad luck to wear something broken," she would say firmly as she took the damaged pendant, often chipped or cracked, from me. Whenever the vibrant green of the jade began to fade and turn dull, it had to be replaced. "The stone has used up its power to protect you," she explained.

Over time, I no longer noticed the jade resting against my skin. Its cool presence was a **quiet constant in my life**. Though it had become part of me, I was no longer sure if I still believed in **its power**. I could not help but wonder: What if it's true? What if my mother was right? 10

Then one day after Physical Education class, I realised something was wrong. **My chest felt too light**. I reached up and my neck felt bare. The string must have snapped while I was running. **A wave of panic surged through me**. I dropped to the grass, brushing aside leaves and dirt as I searched frantically, but it was nowhere to be found. 15

That evening, after my **confession**, my mother's face hardened. "How could you be so careless?" she cried. "That jade kept you safe! I just can't buy you a new **one**. Something bad may happen!" 20

That night, I lay wide awake in bed. I wondered if anything else could take its place, perhaps a lucky coin or a simple charm to keep me safe. I had heard they brought good luck too, but deep down, I knew nothing could truly replace the jade pendant.

I could not shake the feeling that something might go wrong. I started staying alert to my surroundings, steering clear of crowded places, and being mindful of what I ate. To keep myself from falling sick, I made it a point to drink plenty of water and take breaks to rest. 25

In school, a **dark cloud** loomed over me. Without the jade, I was convinced I would stumble through an answer I did not know when the teacher called on me. I also worried that I would not do well in exams. That fear pushed me to work harder: I listened closely, took careful notes, and revised daily. Before long, my grades began to improve. 30

One day, my teacher gave me a smile. "Meng, you have become such a bright and diligent student," she said. "Keep it up!"

That evening, I stood in front of the mirror. My neck was bare and yet I felt unafraid. I set my books on the desk for the next day's revision, filled a glass of water, and switched off the lights. I slept soundly that night and never looked back. 35
