



Several areas in Singapore experienced flash floods last December following heavy rainfall. The intense downpour triggered flooding in Bukit Timah and Dunearn Road, with water levels reaching ankle height. The torrent caused traffic to come to a standstill as vehicles moved at a crawling speed through the flood waters. PUB* officers were stationed at various locations to assist motorists and efficiently directed traffic away from flooded areas. The weather agency reported that the rain persisted for over three hours, with the highest rainfall recorded in the central region. Several trees were uprooted due to the strong winds that accompanied the heavy rain, causing additional traffic disruptions. 

The extract below is taken from an article about skincare advertisements.

Advertisements tend to make bold claims, but how true are they? For instance, skincare advertisements promise good skin is just one purchase away, leaving out information about possible side effects. Furthermore, the promises are rarely supported by scientific evidence.

Many consumers are unaware that skincare advertisements generally use heavily edited images. The models appear to possess flawless skin, which is, in fact, impossible to achieve naturally. This creates unrealistic expectations, causing people to keep spending on skincare products in their pursuit of perfection. Consumers must learn to see beyond what skincare advertisements show. Although some products are genuinely effective, most advertisements merely play on consumers' insecurities and desires, convincing them that they need the products to feel good about themselves.
