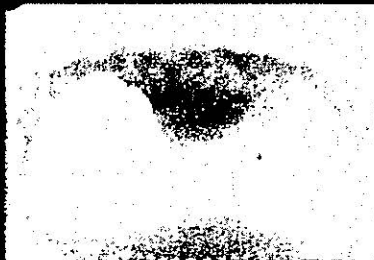

I was hiking with Sam and Kyle, participants in my hiking tour, to show them a cliff where they could feel the sea spray on their faces. I knew the area could be dangerous, but I was not worried for I had hiked the two kilometres to Pagat Cliff many times since I had arrived in Guam four years earlier to be a guide.

5 We sat in the sun and watched the waves hurl themselves against the rough volcanic rock. They were smashing spectacularly. I figured it was safe enough to go closer. I crept up gingerly to the edge, Kyle right behind me, to feel the salty mist. I found a seat-shaped depression and sat down with much contentment. When Kyle came near, I looked around but there was no other place as comfortable, so I gave him mine. He settled in and I moved a few feet over where the smooth rock had no holds. Sam stood farther back, phone poised to take a video.

10 Suddenly, a monstrous wave reared up before us. We braced ourselves. I felt myself starting to slide. "Grab a rock!" I thought to myself, hoping that I could grasp hold of one, but there was none. The water washed me off the cliff and forced me under. I screamed for help. I swam hard for the shore. I was not a strong swimmer but I tried anyway, battling the warm water the best I could. Soon, I realised the sea had sucked me farther out. I was about one hundred metres from shore. I started swimming for shore one more time but was washed even farther out to sea before I made much progress.

"Sam!" I yelled above the waves. "Kyle, help me and send a helicopter!"

20 After about thirty minutes, still no helicopter came. I was anxious and was getting increasingly tired. I fought hard against the relentlessness of gravity. Interrupted by mouthfuls of saltwater, I kept praying out loud. Then, I saw it. It was a fully-outfitted helicopter from the naval base. I could see Sam and Kyle looking anxiously from the helicopter. My eyes lit up and my heart missed a beat.

25 The helicopter buzzed overhead, then kept on going. I floated on my back to make myself more visible, my body pale in contrast to the darker ocean. When the helicopter came by again, I moved my arms and legs desperately to attract their attention. Again, the helicopter vanished into the horizon. Helpless, I stared in disbelief as they missed seeing me twice in a row. Deciding that I needed to conserve my energy, I continued floating on my back and closed my eyes.

30 Gradually, a noise rose above the swish and crash of the water. It grew louder, and I soon recognised the whirring of helicopter blades that steadied overhead. The crew had seen me, but it might be too late. Waves of exhaustion overwhelmed me. My leg muscles tightened uncontrollably. "This is it," I thought, as I surrendered to the weight that was pulling me down. I felt a strong arm wrap across my chest and turned to see a rescue diver spit out his snorkel just long enough to ask me if I was alright. He went underwater to secure a harness on me. The next thing I knew, I was in the air. The waves that had just been big enough to kill me suddenly seemed small and placid in the distance.

40 I should not have survived after two hours in the water. "It's a miracle," one of the paramedics said. "Most people would have lost consciousness in the first hour," another added. I thanked my lucky stars as I lay on the floor of the helicopter, feeling giddy and cold, vomiting seawater, inbound to safety.
