

What do you do with your orange peels and apple cores? Most people throw them into the trash can. Many gardeners put their food waste in a special container known as a compost bin. Food waste can be broken down by bacteria and other micro-organisms into natural materials called compost. This process takes several months. Once the compost is created, gardeners spread this mixture in their gardens to add nutrients to the soil which helps plants to grow well.

The process of compost creation requires oxygen. Thus, the compost bin needs to be turned regularly to ensure air reaches all parts of its content. Some people use a specially designed compost bin that rotates which saves time and energy. Heat speeds up the process. Thus, a compost bin should be in the sun for at least part of the day. However, it should be covered to keep some moisture in as water is also needed in this process.

Garden waste like grass clippings and dried leaves should be added to create a healthy balance in your compost. Do not add weeds unless you want to grow weeds in your garden as the seeds from some weeds may be present in the compost. However, it can be a welcome surprise if you find a tomato plant sprouting when you had not planted one. The tomato seed would have been hiding in the compost, waiting to begin a new life in your garden.
