Each year, between May and September, more than a thousand leatherback turtles make the arduous journey across the Pacific to lay their eggs along the stretch of Turtle Beach near Kuala Trengganu, in the east coast of Malaysia. The Malaysian government maintains a hatchery there to protect them. A quota system limits the number of eggs which local residents may collect. The rest of the eggs are guarded at the hatchery until they become hatchlings and are ready to return to sea.

This intervention is necessary because the leatherback is fast becoming an endangered species. While other sea creatures pose a danger to their decreasing population by preying on their hatchlings, humans are even deadlier. Sometimes, entire nests of eggs are wiped out due to human greed.

During the egg-laying season, throngs of tourists will make the pilgrimage to Turtle Beach. There, they get to experience watching the magnificent leatherback laying her eggs in the sand. In the dark of night, they huddle together on the cool sand and speak in whispers. When their guide raises a hand, everyone understands his cue. They will quieten down at once and in total silence, they will wait.

About a hundred metres away, a massive form emerges from the water and lurches across the sand. With monumental effort, the creature moves slowly across the sand dunes. Barely twenty metres away from the crowd, the turtle stops and sweeps the sand with her huge flippers. This creates a narrow opening in the ground. Then, she positions her tail over it and begins to lay her eggs. The curious onlookers touch her hard shell while children pose for pictures on her back. Oblivious to all this, the giant leatherback continues depositing her eggs.

Two employees of the hatchery now join the circle of tourists. When the turtle has deposited the last of her ninety-odd eggs, she lunges aside, covering the hole with sand. Then she turns towards the water. The crowd trails her to the edge of the water, where the leatherback, regaining her grace, slices through the water with her powerful flippers. A thunderous applause follows. Meanwhile, the two employees start on their job of protecting her eggs. Surrounding the eggs with a barbed wire fence and covering them with more sand, they work quickly and efficiently. Hopefully, this nest of eggs will hatch into baby leatherbacks.
